2. MINUTE OF LAST MEETING:

3. MATTERS ARISING:

Parking Meeting – no date yet

Dorchester Mineshaft – still waiting to hear back from McTaggart and Mickel

Kelvindale Station – David circulated Laurence's draft proposal and asked for any comments to be given to either him or Laurence. David will also post the draft proposal on the Kelvindale Community website. 'Friends of the Maryhill Line' to be launched on 13th May 2014, in Ledgowan Community Hall.

Playpark - £5000 short but have an application to Area Budget to cover the shortfall. Paths have been re-surfaced.

Puppet Theatre Pathway – cut back and tidy.

Kelvin Walkway – wall repaired.

Weymouth Drive Mineshaft – Glasgow City Council (GCC) is monitoring the situation and until a crack appears will do nothing. Caroline will write to GCC and ask them to send monthly monitoring reports to us, she will also ask our Councillors to keep going with the issue. The item will be put on the agenda each month. It was also suggested that the residents affected should put pressure on their MSP and MP, think about a civil case and also contact the press and media to highlight the situation.

5. POLICE REPORT:

Over the period 24th March to 24th April 2014, 40 crimes (e.g. thefts, attempted thefts, misuse of drugs, traffic offences) were reported in the Kelvindale area. There were 11 detections. Caroline asked about Police provision over the Commonwealth Games. Community Police did not know but suggested writing to Chief Superintendent Andy Bates . Caroline will write. Any parking issues telephone 101 or Glasgow Community Safety.
