3. MATTERS ARISING: KCC Membership

4. POLICE REPORT:

24 crimes in last reporting period of which 12 were acquisitive (break-ins, thefts). Operation Neighbourhood Team is active in trying to catch those involved. A house break-in initiative will take place on Friday 20 January 2017. Police to attend at the back of Kelvindale Primary School around 8.45am with a speed gun to deter speeding.

5. BUSES:

Publicity required for new M4 bus. All bus stops in the area need up-to-date timetables. Ken has leaflets to be delivered regarding the new service. Ken has received feedback and residents feel that the hourly service is inadequate to build a customer base. The 94 bus leaves Anniesland around the same time as the M4 which means passengers will get on it if it comes first. This will affect the usage stats on the M4. Martin suggested we send e-mail feedback to 1st Bus every month and cc Elected Members. Mention the positive aspects of the service as well as feedback from the public. Carol will send this e-mail.
